



Bank of America Opens the Door to Bitcoin: Wall Street Makes Crypto Official (2026)

Summary

Bank of America has officially allowed its wealth advisors to **recommend Bitcoin allocations of 1–4%** to suitable clients through **regulated spot Bitcoin ETFs**, starting **January 5, 2026**.

This follows a **policy update in December 2025**, enabling over **15,000 advisors across Merrill, Private Bank, and Merrill Edge** to guide clients using ETFs like **BlackRock’s IBIT, Fidelity’s FBTC, Bitwise’s BITB, and Grayscale’s Mini Trust**.

This is backed by **internal CIO guidance and training**, framing Bitcoin as a **portfolio diversifier similar to digital gold** — a major step toward **mainstream crypto adoption**.

Clients don’t need to manage wallets or exchanges. Bitcoin exposure sits safely in a **regulated, familiar ETF**, making it as straightforward as adding a stock or bond to a portfolio.
